Dear Friends of TBTA,

The production you are about to see tonight is a result of the hard work and shared energy of a number of people, and I'd like to begin by acknowledging them. The mere thanks is not enough, but I hope that they have all had joy equal to mine in their contribution to this process. First, I have to thank my family for being the rock that they are in my life; without their help, I would have nothing, would be nothing. Secondly, I want to acknowledge my teachers for fostering my love of the theatre and never letting me give up, particularly Zachary Moore and Clista Townsend, for giving me a chance to live in the language of the Bard. My love and affection also goes out to the family here at TBTA, particularly Michael for giving me this opportunity and for constantly pushing me to be better than I think I am, and getting out of my own way. I have to thank my producers and my crew for being the incredible individuals and cohesive team that they are, and for their flexibility and willingness to adapt and grow with me. To my designers, especially Meg and Lexx, for keeping me focused and providing amazing support artistically, and for making our work look good. And to my beautiful, wonderful, strong, smart, sassy, talented, eager, focused, driven and FUN cast, who have breathed new life into words that I love dearly and are telling a beautiful story both on stage and off. My last thanks must go to my beautiful Assistant Director, Joy. Not only would this show not have been possible without you, the energy you bring to my life is incredibly powerful and inspirational; I could not ask for a better creative partner. Thank you all.

My goal in crafting this production was twofold. First, I wanted to show that Shakespeare's language is still accessible 400 years later, and second, to share my love of Shakespeare with a cast of actors that hadn't all met him yet. I like to think that both of those goals were accomplished. However, early on, a friend of mine asked me "Why *Much Ado*? Why not another play?". I thought for a moment, and the answer was easy. In *Much Ado*, we see many different characters, each with their own chance at happiness and fullfillment. For some, this requires submission to their emotions and feelings; for others, it requires letting go and forgiving; for still others, happiness comes from realizing the value of their own lives. Each of them though has some block or another that gets in the way. Some are able to joyously overcome themselves and find it. Others are not so lucky. My challenge to you as an audience is to take a look at your own lives and find what makes you truly, deeply happy. And once you know it, go get it. There is nothing that really holds you back from a meaningful existence. As Shakespeare himself said in *The Winter's Tale*:

"When you do dance, I wish you A wave o' th' sea, that you might ever do Nothing but that."
