Ase-AmenRa Kariamu of Kariamu Afrikan Drum and Dance, affectionately known as Brother Ase, began his drumming with master drummer, Brother Keindre O'Uhuru, director of the El Shabazz Orchestra in Harlem, NY. For the past eight years, he has worked for the CT Ballet 'Out Reach' program, teaching in the Juvenile Detention Center. Mr. Kariamu was 'Mouse King' in the Danbury Music Centre's annual production of *Nutcracker* several times and has been a flutist for over 20 years. His instructors also include Yamoussa Camara, master dancer/drummer of Guinea, West Afrika; and KoKayi, an Afrikan Dance Troupe of Mt. Vernon. Mr. Kariamu hosts West Afrikan Drum workshops throughout Connecticut and teaches in the Danbury after-school program in fourteen schools. He also teaches at 'A Common Ground'. He has been director of the DMC Afrikan Drumming program since 2003. His unique sculptures and percussion instruments are on display in our lobby.

Haitian Health Foundation

A Charitable Outreach to Neighbors in Need

With the "community" part of community theater in mind, TBTA will be accepting donations for **Haitian Health Foundation** during the month of July. HHF's main facilities are located in Jérémie, the western end of Haiti, where people depend on subsistence farming, charcoal production and other menial jobs for their livelihood. The average income is just \$90-\$300 US per year. The area is very isolated, and even under the most favorable conditions, communication is scant with no health services for the poor. Living conditions are dehumanizing—families crushed into hovels of banana leaves and thatch, shacks unsuitable for human habitation. It is heartbreaking to see children rooting with animals through the garbage for scraps of food. HHF has created a stable and loving preventive and curative health and development program in the poorest area of the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. In addition to the city of Jérémie, HHF provides support to over 100 rural mountain villages. While cynics decry the impotence of individuals to change the world, HHF continues to change lives—one person at a time. HHF is proud of an overhead of less than 8 cents per donated dollar, with over 92 percent of funds going directly to services for the poor.

ONCE ON THIS ISLAND, set in Haiti, begins with a terrible storm and an orphaned girl is taken in by a couple that have very little to give other than love. The fable they tell her to calm her from the storm becomes the story of our show. When \$600 can build a sturdy cement home and \$300 can feed a malnourished child for a year, we hope to raise enough to build a few homes and provide a substantial amount of food.
