Dear TBTA Family,

There are some shows that feel like they come in the form of gifts, shows that pick you rather than the reverse. I always know I will end up staging such shows when the time is right. Immediately after deciding to stage *Dog Sees God*, the flood gate seemed to open with a rush of news stories about youth suicides in the LGBTQ community as the result of bullying. The time was not only right, but acutely necessary. When the statistics are consistently clear that gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender students are at least four times more likely to attempt suicide than their heterosexual peers, the issue cannot be ignored. Ultimately this is not a "gay issue", but more an issue of very clearly looking at how we treat others, how we are willing to allow others to be treated in our presence, the language we use and the things we are willing to allow to be the punch line of a joke.

I am once again thankful that our community has shown such overwhelming support in our continued mission to use theatre, at least in some small way, to create positive change. The outpouring of compassion that we experienced in response to our production of *The Laramie Project* has fueled our commitment to continue to present thought provoking work.

I would also like to take the opportunity to thank the amazing cast and crew of *Dog Sees God* for their dedication, trust and spirit. It is an honor to get to work so closely with a group of people with such passion, talent and heart, who are all so keenly aware of the impact the arts can have on our culture. I am blessed to have shared this experience with such a beautiful group.

We look forward to seeing you for the exciting 2011 season we have planned here at The Brookfield Theatre for the Arts.
