DIRECTOR'S NOTES

In recent rehearsals our actors have discussed, "So what is 'Moonlight and Magnolias' anyway? What does it mean?" As it happens, "Moonlight and Magnolia" is a phrase that refers to the romanticized ideal of the pre-Civil War South. Originally alluding to soft lighting and flower scents, the phrase now is used in a more ironic tone "in reference to a previous way of looking at life that is now considered unrealistic and sentimentally false."

"You can drop the 'Moonlight and Magnolia' Scarlett! So, things have been going well at Tara, have they?" —Rhett Butler

1939. Producer David O Selznick had earlier obtained the rights to a blockbuster book...one of the biggest of all time...and was trying to bring it to life as a motion picture. He was a relatively young producer for his day, but managed by talent and marriage to find himself as one of the more prominent of his kind. And he knew his role—it was his book, his studio and it was to be his movie.

But, there was a bit of a problem. The screenplay was awful, he was dissatisfied with his director and frustrated by his situation. So three weeks into filming he shut down production, fired his director, grabbed a new director off another set (it was just a little movie anyway), hauled in a screenwriter with the reputation of being "the Shakespeare of Hollywood" and set about to right the ship. The clock was ticking so the goal became "five days, one screenplay". He could do that, because he was...the boss!

Interesting times they were. The time of the absolute dictator producer was waning. New winds would begin to blow in Hollywood bringing with them new illusions. New winds were blowing in Europe as well—winds that were to forever change the world—and the lives of millions of Jews.

A new movie was to be launched, telling the story of very similar winds that swept away the "Ideal world" of the old south.

Playwright Ron Hutchinson based his story on true events. *Moonlight and Magnolias* is both funny and thought provoking. Bringing this wonderful work to life has been a true joy. Contemplate the parallels between the south of 1861, the illusions of Hollywood and the world in 1939, the challenges, the struggles and the perseverance it took to meet those challenges and come out alright.

Quite a story. One that continues to be relevant today.

We hope you enjoy our telling of *Moonlight and Magnolias*.
