#### FROM THE DIRECTOR

"Do the kind of things that come from the heart. When you do, you won't be dissatisfied, you won't be envious, you won't be longing for somebody else's things. On the contrary, you'll be overwhelmed with what comes back" — Morrie Schwartz

What an amazing goal to which we can aspire. It can be said that Morrie Schwartz, to borrow an expression from Jimmy Durante, had "...a million of 'em". But these aren't just hap hazard phrases that the professor coined to somehow cement his own posterity or to make it easier for Mitch Albom to write a best seller. No. The beauty and inspiration of Morrie's words is that he believed what he said and lived his life accordingly. Right to the end.

Morrie was the consummate teacher, educating everyone around him by the living of his own life. Mitch Albom was not only fortunate to have his Professor, Morrie Schwartz, in college, but he also had the chance to learn more from him later in life. In the book description on Amazon.com it reads, "...Mitch Albom had that second chance. He rediscovered Morrie in the last months of the older man's life. Knowing he was dying, Morrie visited with Mitch in his study every Tuesday, just as they used to back in college. Their rekindled relationship turned into one final class: lessons in how to live..."

If Morrie's passion was living and teaching, then his student Mitch's is listening, learning and storytelling. The result is a beautiful marriage that elevates both teacher and student and has become a story for the ages.

In 1978, I graduated from Fairfield University and earned my BA in Political Science. I was fortunate to have the chance to be taught by some wonderful professors, one of whom taught me much more than "Politics and Government" and "Constitutional Law". He taught me about life. Professor Carmen Donnarumma was wise, smart, funny, seasoned, savvy and above all, honest. This was a man who cared much more about listening than he did about hearing his own voice. For several years after Fairfield, we kept in touch. I was working in National Politics at the time and he was always available for a telephone call or better yet, a face to face over a nice glass of scotch. Then, life happened and we did not see one another for many years. Until I attended his wake last March. After 94 years, this giant of a man had earned his rest. And I didn't get to thank him just one more time.

So, we are proud and honored to offer this story of love, passion, dedication and perseverance. We hope you enjoy your time with Morrie and Mitch and hope that they touch your hearts as they have touched ours.
