With so many moving songs and the creativity of the entire team, it is a very special offering which I hope you will appreciate and enjoy. Our 59th Season of Shows continues in September with *The Other Place* by Sharr White. His plays have been pro-duced at several regional venues. *The Other Place* had its Off-Broadway premiere in a limited in 2011. The play then had its West Coast premiere in 2012 and its Broadway premiere in 2013. It received two Outer Critics Circle Award nominations, for Outstanding New Off-Broadway Play and Outstanding Actress In A Play (Laurie Metcalf). It is a contemporary thriller about memory, wellness, and relationships, and is directed by Alicia Dempster.

We end our season with *Speed-the-Plow*, by David Mamet (Pulitzer Prize winner for *Glengarry Glen Ross*). It is a cynical look at the film industry and is considered Mamet's funniest comedy. It will be directed by John Schwanke. Auditions will be coming up later this summer—please watch our web site for information.

We also have several special events on our calendar including improv comedy nights with **17 Debacles** on Oct. 1 and Dec. 3, a special **Halloween** event on Sat., Oct. 29th, and our annual **Paddy's Celebration** on Sat., Nov. 26th. We hope you will join us — please mark your calendars!
