Thank you for joining us again on our 60th anniversary journey. This past summer we featured "Damn Yankees," a musical about the great American game of baseball. We are proud to now present Frost/Nixon, by Peter Morgan—a play about the other great American game of politics. Our director, cast and crew have work incredibly hard to bring you a show that is both entertaining and honest.

OUR HISTORY

The Country Players of Brookfield was founded in 1957 by Tillie Ciccala and Dot French. Plays were initially performed in church halls and school auditoriums. After a school complained about an actress appearing on stage in a slip, it became clear that this band of players needed a home of its own. After refurbishing this building (originally the Curtis school gym built in 1907), it has been the permanent home of the Country Players of Brookfield. The organization eventually grew to include a wide range of cultural offerings and, in 2003, changed its name to "Brookfield Theatre for the Arts, Inc." (shortened to TBTA or Brookfield Theatre) to reflect this commitment. At the same time, plans began for the building of a lobby annex to offer a gathering place for social events and concerts, and gallery space for art exhibits. The new lobby was dedicated in 2005. This year marks our 60th anniversary and our re-dedication as an all-volunteer, non-profit organization providing quality live performances, cultural events, and educational workshops to the community.

A Note From The Director

While assigned with the USAF in Europe during the 1970's, I had the opportunity, for a few weeks, to serve in communications with Air Force One while Nixon was President. Despite this experience, I viewed the American drama from afar. When he left office, I had been in Europe almost three years. During those years I got married and started a family. When I returned home, it was not the same America. There was no more Vietnam War, my hippie hair was on the floor at the boot camp barbershop, and I had a new title as veteran. I served a total of 22 years in the Air Force, Coast Guard, and Navy and am presently a veterans' representative at Manchester Community College. However, it was those early military years I remember most.

Later, as a legal administrator in NYC for the entertainment law firm of Tanner, Propp, and Farber, I attended a movie premier for *For Love or Money*, starring Michael J. Fox. At the party, I met Ron Howard, who would direct the movie, *Frost/Nixon*.

Because of these two events, I feel a connection with the play. I have directed it so that anyone having lived the period or born afterward could feel what I did back then. I have added 6 ensemble to the script to enhance the period and a great amount of technical qualities so that everyone can live the period.

Back then, while in London, I theatre hopped a lot and took photos. An original photo I took of the theater premiering *Jesus Christ Superstar* is used in this production.

Please sit back and enjoy an historical journey of the 1970s, and an event that seems to be repeating itself. It is documentary and as real as it can get. My hope is that students will learn from it, seniors will remember some of the good times we had, and that everyone will acknowledge how important it is that we as Americans can use our history to make our country a more unified and caring place.
