It means creating a fiercely open space where diverse opinions are not only tolerated but invited in order to heighten the ability to listen and increase awareness. It is a place that honors the past while opening up the future for possibility. And, due to its nature, this is something that can never truly "be" but must always be an active "working toward".

For a show like WILD PARTY, there are so many challenges including the normal challenges of scheduling, managing the space, technology, memorizing lines and blocking. Nurturing a space that is supportive of each other creatively and emotionally has been an essential part of growing this show and I thank Todd and the cast and crew for consistently sharing kindness, encouragement, and support for each through every step of this rehearsal process.

The final component of a "brave space" is engagement with you our audience to create an exchange that we hope you will find entertaining, thought provoking, and meaningful. I want to encourage any audience member who wants or needs to talk after the show to please reach out to a Board member or other team member. We are always here to talk!

We hope you will return in November when we finish off on a lighter note with SUITE SURRENDER—a comic farce about rival divas fighting over a hotel suite during a benefit concert. The show is directed by Marilyn Olsen who was our Mrs. Lovett in this summer's SWEENEY TODD and they have already begun rehearsals with a wonderful team!

For our younger theatre lovers, our Spotlight Program returns beginning on Sat., Sept. 22 every Saturday from 3 to 6pm. Directed by Purvi Dudhedia, the program is a free youth theatre program for students ages 9 to 15. This fall they begin with theatre games, skits and songs culminating in a Spotlight Showcase in December. Then, in January, auditions will be held for our Spotlight Youth musical. Please watch for an announcement coming soon or email the theatre for more information.
