While wandering the empty streets alone one night, Johnny meets Whatsername, but just as his life begins to turn around, St. Jimmy spins it around again bringing Johnny near to a self-destructive end. Whatsername won't hang around to watch Johnny kill himself with drugs so she leaves him.

Meanwhile, Will has sunk into alcoholism and Heather leaves him taking their newbown child with her. He is utterly alone.

Tunny's adventures have led him to be deployed to a war zone. He wakes up in a hospital bed discovering he has lost a leg. At his lowest point, Tunny discovers the Extraordinary Girl—a military nurse turned fantasy by a druginduced dream.

As Johnny hits rock bottom, he decides to finally take control of his life. Johnny turns his back on his alter-ego in "The Death of St. Jimmy" and sells his guitar to get back home.

The show ends with the three friends returning home. With all they have gained and lost, the friendship remains. It seems the perfect note on which to end this 2019 season and we hope you have enjoyed the journey with us.
