OUR HISTORY

The Country Players of Brookfield was founded in 1957 by Tillie Ciccala and Dot French with an ad in the local newspaper asking, "Are you a ham?" They found many hams to join their ranks and their first play was produced in 1958. Plays were initially performed in church halls and school auditoriums. After a school complained about an actor appearing on stage with no shirt, it became clear that the band of players needed a home of its own. After refurbishing this building (originally the Curtis school gym built in 1907), it has been the permanent home of Brookfield's community theater. The organization eventually grew to include a wide range of cultural offerings and, in 2003, changed its name to "The Brookfield Theatre for the Arts, Inc." to reflect this commitment. At the same time, plans began for the building of a lobby annex to offer a gathering place for social events and concerts, and gallery space for art exhibits. The new lobby was dedicated in 2005. This year marks Brookfield's 64th year as an all-volunteer, non-profit organization providing quality live performances, cultural events, and educational workshops to the community. Jesse Lewis Choose Love Movement™ is a nonprofit organization with a mission to ensure that every child has access to Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) in their classrooms and to help facilitate this teaching within their families, schools and communities. Founder Scarlett Lewis' six-yearold son, Jesse Lewis, was murdered in his first-grade classroom at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Newtown, Connecticut in December 2012, alongside 19 of his classmates, and six educators in one of the worst mass shootings in U.S. history. Scarlett found out shortly after the tragedy that Jesse used his final moments to heroically save nine of his classmates. When the

shooter stopped to reload, Jesse yelled to his classmates to run while he stayed by his teacher's side.

Before Jesse's funeral, Scarlett found a message he wrote on their kitchen chalkboard shortly before he died, "Norturting Helinn Love" (Nurturing, Healing Love). These words are not in the vernacular of a six-year-old and were phonetically spelled because Jesse was in first grade and just learning to write. However, they are in the definition of compassion across all cultures. Love is as necessary to our healthy existence as food and water and is a universal need that connects all of humanity. Scarlett realized the solution is simple. If we infuse our classrooms with love and teach children how to give, and receive love, they won't want to harm one another and could actually add to a more peaceful and loving world.

Scarlett realized this violent act started with an angry thought in the young man's head that was responsible for the mass shooting. She also understood that an angry thought can be changed. Scarlett set out to get Jesse's message into classrooms with the understanding that if the shooter knew how to give and receive "nurturing healing love," that the tragedy would never have happened. Scarlett started the Jesse Lewis Choose Love Movement[™] to foster the understanding that with the right tools, we can educate and encourage individuals to choose loving thoughts over angry thoughts.
