OUR HISTORY

The Country Players of Brookfield was founded in 1957 by Tillie Cicala and Dot French when they placed an ad in the local newspaper asking, "Are you a ham?" They found many hams to join their ranks and their first play was produced in 1958, performing in schools and church halls. After refurbishing this building (originally the Curtis school gym built in 1907), it has been the permanent home of Brookfield's community theater. The organization eventually grew to include a wide range of cultural offerings and, in 2003, changed its name to "The Brookfield Theatre for the Arts, Inc." to reflect this commitment. At the same time, plans began for the building of a lobby annex to offer a gathering place for social events and concerts, and gallery space for art exhibits. The new lobby was dedicated in 2005. This year marks Brookfield's 65th year as an all-volunteer, non-profit organization providing quality live performances, cultural events, and educational workshops to the community.

Adam Battelstein (Fight Choreographer) spent 19 years with world renowned dance company, Pilobolus. He left something of himself with them and brought something of them with him when he left. His is the founder of Catapult Entertainment which performed 4 times on Season 8 of America's Got Talent for the judges and for millions of viewers. The live audience leapt to their feet before prompters could tell them to; the judges gave standing ovations and America was captivated. Adam has traveled the world as a performer and director, soloed at Carnegie Hall, performed at the 2007 Academy Awards, danced on the Oprah show and can even fit his entire body inside a suitcase.



Christopher Bird (Polonius) studied at HB studios with graduate training at American Conservatory Theatre, San Francisco, and worked in film and television. Stage credits include MOON OVER BUFFALO, MACBETH, GOD OF CARNAGE, THE NORMAL HEART, AN IDEAL HUSBAND, RAVENSCROFT, CAUGHT IN THE NET, VERONICA'S ROOM, MURDERERS, TEMPEST, MERRY WIVES OF WINDSOR, and others. He has also performed in several virtual Shakespeare

productions with Jane over the pandemic.



Tim Breslin (Gravedigger) comes late to acting. Except for a role in a high school play, his first performance was as Reggie in QUARTET at Theatreworks in New Milford in 2019. Since then he has played in several zoom Shakespeare performances under Jane Farnol's direction. In 2021, he was Theseus in an outdoor version of A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM, also under Jane's direction.



Jimmy Collins (Marcellus/Player Queen) is excited to be returning to the stage at Brookfield, fresh off his ensemble role in DISASTER! back in May. He is very excited to be performing as both Marcellus and Player Queen! Jimmy thanks the cast and crew for helping him grow as an actor during this run. He hopes you enjoy the show and thanks you for coming!

Irine Dumitrascu (Set Painting/Poster Design) comes from a theatrical family and was exposed to many aspects of acting throughout her young life. Her first love is the visual arts and she is very excited to show her artwork in the Brookfield Theatre Gallery. She is currently a high school sophomore.



Miles Everett (CLAUDIUS) has appeared at Brookfield Theatre as Felix in THE NORMAL HEART and Rothko in RED. Recent roles have included Morris in THE HEIRESS, Dr Sugar in SUDDENLY LAST SUMMER, Michael in DANCING AT LUGHNASA, and Valmont in DANGEROUS LIASONS. Miles has been a member of Theatre Artists Worshop of Norwalk and studied with Carole Fox Prescott, Marlene Wallace, Kristin Linklater, Nenette Charisse, and the Corvinos.

Jane Farnol (Director) was born in England and trained at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art and Elmhurst Ballet School. At RADA, she developed an abiding love of Shakespeare under the tutelage of octogenarian Miss Nell Carter. Her New York acting credits include Teresa in Brendan Behan's The Hostage at the Sheridan Square Playhouse, the Chorus in The Trojan Women directed by Theodore Mann at Circle in the Square, and Ann in the Broadway production of Hail Scrawdyke! directed by Alan Arkin. At the American Shakespeare Festival Theatre in Stratford, Connecticut, her roles ranged from Titania in A Midsummer Night's Dream playing opposite to and directed by Cyril Ritchard, to Lady Macbeth in Macbeth directed by John Houseman. On television, Jane had running roles on The Guiding Light and As The World Turns. Jane's movie The Colonial Naturalist is shown as a permanent feature at Colonial Williamsburg. At WCBS Radio, Jane was Dave Garroway's assistant and Executive Director of Lee Theodore's American Dance Machine. Since moving to Connecticut Jane has directed over thirty-five plays in eighteen years at various venues.



Maureen Gallagher (Gertrude) is pleased to be joining Jane and everyone at Brookfield Theatre on a visit to Denmark this holiday season. Favorite Shakespeare roles include, Princess of France (LOVES LABOUR'S LOST), Beatrice (MUCH ADO), Mistress Page (MERRY WIVES), Constance (KING JOHN), Titania (A MIDSUMMER'S NIGHTS DREAM), and Tamora (TITUS ANDRONICUS).
